## POLL FINDS A LACK OF PUBLIC SUPPORT FOR LATIN POLICY

Only 1 in 3 Backs Reagan on  
Role in Central America —  
Fear of War Is Voiced

Only one American in three supports President Reagan's policies in Central America, and nearly half the people say they are afraid that those policies might lead the United States into a war there, according to the latest New York Times/CBS News Poll.

Asked about a specific element of American activity in the region, the mining of Nicaraguan harbors, the public responds even more negatively. By 67 percent to 13 percent, the respondents disapproved of American involvement in the mining.

Those findings of the poll of 1,267 adults reflect a general unease that Americans were found to feel toward Mr. Reagan's conduct of foreign affairs.

Skepticism on China Trip

At the same time, one of the initiatives that Reagan Administration officials had hoped would bolster public support of the President's foreign policy, his current trip to China, may al-
